Tumakuru: Stage has been set for the grand opening of 'Anveshan', the Inter-university South Zone Student Research Convention. The two-day event, to be held on 14 & 15 February 2017, is being jointly organized by Tumkur University and Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi.

Dr. G. Parameshwara, Hon'ble Home Minister, Government of Karnataka, will inaugurate the ambitious event at 9-30 am on February 14, at Sir M. Visvesvaraya Auditorium in Tumkur University. Prof. M. K. Abdul Khader, Vice Chancellor, Kannur University, Kerala will be the chief guest.

Dr. Amarendra Pani, Deputy Director (Research), AIU, and Dr. Usha Rai Negi, Assistant Director (Research), AIU, will be the guests of honour. Prof. A. H. Over 110 participants from 23 universities are participating in the convention. There will be both individual and group projects, where each group comprises three members.

Agriculture, Basic Sciences, Engineering & Technology, Health Sciences and Allied Subjects, Pharmacy, Nutrition, etc. and Social Sciences, Humanities, Commerce and Law – are the five categories to which all the projects belong.

Tumkur University has made elaborate arrangements for the suc-

cessful conduct of Anveshan under the guidance of Prof. A. H. Rajasab, Vice Chancellor and Prof. M. Venkateshwarlu, Registrar.

ration with different sponsors for supporting education and training of the young researchers.

• To provide proper incentives to enhance the research skill of potential students.

• To initiate an intensive research culture in the universities and institutions.

Programme Structure The Conventions are held in

three phases. In the First Phase, all universi-

ties in the country are requested to organize an exhibition of research projects at University Level in which students from Affilia ts for the Zonal Level Student Research Convention preferably one each from each category. In case, the universities/ institutes do not offer courses/ programmes in all the categories/areas/fields mentioned above, they can send total five projects from whichever category/area/ field they have from amongst the above specified categories/ areas/ fields. For Example, Agricultural Universities may send five projects from Agriculture Category itself.

Only Bonafide fulltime students from Undergraduate to Doctoral Degree level, who are below 30 years of age, are eligible to take part in the Convention

Assessment & prizes

The projects are assessed by a panel of experts drawn from various disciplines on the basis of laid down criteria for assessment. The students whose projects are selected in the final stage at National Level Convention are given awards by AIU in terms of Trophies, Certificates and Gold Medals.

Winners in the National Student Research Convention are awarded Cash Prizes along with Certificates and Mementos. The amount of Cash Prize for first position holders is Rs 50,000, second position holder is Rs. 30,000 and third position holder is Rs 20,000. The best research project across all the categories/ areas/fields is awarded Prof S

K Mukherjee Gold Medal instituted by AIU in the memory of its former President late Prof S K Mukherjee.

The Projects can be presented in the form of live demonstrations /models / posters/ podium (oral) presentation in any aforementioned categories/areas/fields. Assessment of projects is done in three rounds each at Zonal and National Level. In the first round, the contestants have to display their projects in poster presentations before a panel of judges. If selected in the first round, the projects will be allowed for the second round where the contestants have to make a podium (oral) presentation before the panel of judges. In the third round, the presentation will be open for question-answer. Total time allowed for podium (oral) presentation and question-answers is 10 minutes; seven minutes for presentation and three minutes for question-answers.

Criteria of selection

Scientific Thoughts and Principles - 20 Creativity - 20 Thoroughness - 10 Skill - 10 Relevance - 20 Cost Effectiveness - 10 Teamwork - 10 Apart from the above criteria, scope of commercialization of the projects will be considered as an additional merit. However, there will be no weightage point for this criterion. In case of the projects having scored equal cumulative weightage point, this criterion will be considered for making the final decision.
