**Sub: Declaration of Results for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes through promotion-reg.**

With reference to the above,the procedure adopted by Tumkur University for declaration of results for intermediate semesters of UG (II and IV semesters) & PG (II semester) programmes (courses) for the academic year 2019-20 through promotion is hereby notified.

1. 50% of total marks secured by the candidate in each course (paper) in which he/she has passed during the previous semester (I and III semester in case of UG; I semester in case of PG) will be computed.
2. Internal Assessment (IA) marks secured by the candidate in each course (paper) during the present/next semester (II and IV semester in case of UG; II semester in case of PG) calculated proportionately to 50 marks.
3. The marks computed as explained in steps 1 and 2 above are added to calculate the marks secured by the candidate in each course (paper) for 100 marks.
4. Out of the marks computed for 100 marks as explained in step 3 above, the IA marks secured by the candidate in each course (paper) during the present/next semester will be deducted. The remaining marks will be considered as the marks secured in theory course (paper).
5. In case of practical courses, the marks secured by the candidate during the previous semester will be considered for the corresponding practical course during the present/next semester.
6. For Undergraduate Programmes, in case of compulsory courses (papers) and open elective courses (papers), the marks secured by the candidate during the previous semester will be considered for compulsory courses and open elective courses during the present/next semester.
7. The above procedure is applicable to candidates who have passed all the courses (papers) during the previous semester (I and III semester in case of UG; I semester in case of PG).
8. Candidates who have failed in one or more courses (papers) during the previous semester need to clear the examination for such courses in which he/she has failed or remained absent, whenever the examination is held next.
