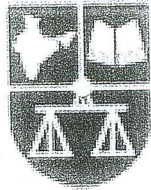

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

PREAMBLE

The National Law School of India University (NLSIU) University, Bangalore, established under the National Law School of India Act (Karnataka Act 22 of 1986) in 1987 with the Chief Justice of India as its Chancellor, is the first and the only law university fully supported by the Bar Council of India and the Bench. One of the main objectives of NLSIU is to 'bring legal education on par with other professional courses like medicine and engineering, where a student fresh out of high-school can make an immediate career choice'. The NLSIU has been conducting a strong B.A, LL.B (Hons.), LL.M, M.Phil., Ph.D and LL.D programs in all Social Sciences and Law. The NLSIU has made strides in teaching the law courses with both interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary dimensions and facilitating research and publication on those lines since its establishment.

The Tumkur University was established in 2004 by an Act of the Karnataka Legislature with Tumkur District as its Jurisdiction. Presently, the University offers twenty Post Graduate courses such as M.A (Kannada), MA (Eng), M.A (History), M.A (Economics), M.A (Political Science), M.A (Sociology), Master of Social work, M.Sc (Math), M.Sc (Chemistry), M.Sc (Physics), M.Sc (Biochemistry), M.Sc (Biotechnology) M.Sc (psychology), M.Sc (Environmental Science), M.Sc (Electronic Media), M.S (Communication), M.Sc (Library and Information Science), M.Com., M.Ed and MBA in the university departments and affiliated colleges. The total number of affiliated colleges of the university has gone up to eighty four. Total strength of the students in Tumkur University and affiliated colleges are 4,589 and 20,500 respectively.

Whereas, Tumkur University desires to establish academic collaboration with Institutions of excellence in Social Sciences in the country and NLSIU is one among such recognized institutions and seeks to promote the institutional collaborations through this Memorandum of Understanding.
